Maxwell Hutchinson AADipl, PPRIBA, Past President of the RIBA, will be Chairing the Seminar and reviewing our Andy Swan Award projects. He is a practising architect from The Hutchinson Studio and well-known radio and television broadcaster, with particular knowledge of external wall insulation

Keynote Speaker: Joanna Warner, Head of Policy, Heat & Energy Saving Strategy, Department of Energy & Climate Change, worked on the Heat and Energy Saving Strategy consultation, published in February 2009, which set out the Government's long-term plans for improving the energy efficiency of our existing building stock and decarbonising the supply of heat.

Lead Morning Speaker: Wayne Smith, National Business Development Manager, British Gas, has worked in the energy efficiency sector since 2002 and is responsible for developing and implementing community energy efficiency programmes, specifically targeting low income households, such as 'here to HELP', which has helped 320,000 households.
